

Seekonk Meadows

MISSION:

Seekonk Meadows offer stewardship of a nine-acre recovered natural setting that provides passive recreation opportunities and environmental education to members of the Seekonk community.

GUIDELINES:

- Passive recreational activities are allowed that do not endanger the capped landfill and respect other users. Passive recreational activities are encouraged and include:
 - Walking/Running
 - Wildlife Observation
 - Photography
 - Snowshoeing

- Activities on the site should maintain the integrity of the natural setting of the Meadows.
 - The meadows are open from dawn to dusk.
 - Pets must be leashed and owners must clean up after them.
 - Visitors are to carry out what they carry in.

- Not allowed in the Meadows are recreational activities that could potentially endanger the capped landfill. Activities not allowed include:
 - Motorized vehicles, horses or bicycles
 - Hunting, fishing or trapping
 - Climbing on passive landfill gas vents
 - Digging not authorized by the Department of Public Works (DPW)
 - Collecting plants
 - Camping or open fires
 - Alcoholic beverages, littering

- Gatherings in the Meadows are limited to the amount of available parking spaces (86-133 vehicles) and the capacity of the amphitheater (220 persons)

- Any group of over 30 persons is required to obtain a permit for use. Gatherings of over 100 persons are discouraged.

- Request for use forms for the amphitheater, groups of over 30 persons or other uses will be reviewed at the monthly meeting of the Seekonk Meadows Committee and then forwarded to the Seekonk Library Board of Trustees for final determination.
